

The dry eye evaluation is a comprehensive analysis involving clinical examination, diagnostic imaging and lab testing. The office visit with the doctor is billable to your medical insurance. The following aspects of the evaluation are out-of-pocket. Each of these components are important to help your doctor accurately evaluate the type of dry eye disease you have and tailor treatment to you.

- 1. Oculus Keratograph Imaging—\$59
- 2. Inflammadry Test for ocular inflammation—\$29
- 3. Omega-3 Index—\$49

Total out of pocket fees: \$137

Prior to your Dry Eye Evaluation:

- o Avoid using eye ointments or gel drops the night prior
- o Do not use any lubricating artificial tear drops during the day
- Do not wear contact lenses during the day
- o Avoid wearing eye makeup the day of your evaluation
- You should continue to use prescription eye drops. We can advise you on the best time for medication dosing based on the time your dry eye evaluation is scheduled.
